



## MINIATURE BRONZE RHINO SCULPTURES

As part of its fund raising efforts, the Rhino and Elephant Foundation has commissioned Keith Calder to sculpt a black rhinoceros. A limited number of 450 will be cast, each work being numbered and mounted on a wooden base.

Keith Calder, born in 1959, completed his schooling in Johannesburg and joined the National Parks Board in 1980. He obtained a diploma in nature conservation, completing the final practical year running safaris and wilderness trails in Botswana and South Africa.

In 1983 Keith was conscripted to the conservation division of the South African Defence Force which allowed him to travel and work extensively. While on assignment in the Kruger National Park, he contracted malaria and during his recuperation was able to complete his first study of a buffalo.

Following his national service, Keith continued to run safaris to Botswana and South West Africa/Namibia and at the same time refined and honed his talents as a sculptor.

His first major commission was for St Sithians College in Johannesburg. Other commissions include an elephant cow and calf for Pretoria Teachers' Training College, five running buffalo for Hollandia Reinsurance Group and a life-size cheetah for Dexion Formrite Building.

This miniature bronze sculpture measures 13 cm x 6 cm (excluding base). The sculptures will be available in January 1990 at R460 (inclusive of postage, packing and GST).
