



GOVERNOR SHOWN WHITE RHINO SKULL

When the Governor of Uganda, Sir Frederick Crawford (right) was on safari in the Northern Province recently, he was shown this skull of a white rhino at the Community Development Training centre at Arua in West Nile. The white rhino is one of the Protectorate's rarest animals, and it is believed that there are only about 350 left, most of which are situated in the Obongi-Kali region of West Nile. Increased poaching is threatening the existence of the rhino, for although the animal is protected by law such high prices are paid for its horn that poachers will take almost any risk to obtain one. Consequently, the Uganda Game Department is now considering a plan to move some of the rhino to the Murchison Falls National Park. (photo by A. C. T. Ward).
