A Hartmann's Mountain Zebra (Equus zebra hartmanni), born in the Menagerie on April 12th.

A Babirusa (Babirussa babirussa), born in the Menagerie on April 23rd.

The SECRETARY read the following Report on the Additions to the Society's Menagerie during the month of May 1933:—

The registered additions to the Society's Menagerie in London (Mammals Birds, and Reptiles) during the month of May were 360 in number. Of these
