The House for Giraffes and greater Antelopes has now been completed and all the animals like their new indoor and outdoor enclosures. Several young have been born already in this new building.

Within the next few weeks the new Pheasantry will also be finished, to replace the two old buildings for exotic birds.

Excavations are well under way for the new pools for sea Lions, Sea Elephants and Penguins in the area of the post-war stone-hill. New arrivals include: a Reticulated Giraffe, 2 Heuglin's Gazelles, 5 Maxwell Duikers, a Vicuna, 2 Lowland Tapirs, 2 Crowned Duikers, 2 Ross Touracous, 2 White-cheeked Touracos, and 2 Cuban Flamingos.

Births include: 2 Grant's Gazelles, a Greater Kudu, a Lesser Kudu, a Soemmering Gazelle, 2 Impala Antelopes, a Singha Gazelle, a Dorcas Gazelle, 2 Bushbucks, a Blue Gnu, an Addax Antelope, a Maneless Zebra, a Bison, a Yak, a Thar, 3 Jaguars, 2 Leopards, a Drill, and 3 Axis Deer.

Montreal - Canada

The newly formed Zoological Society of Montreal announces plans to build a comprehensive Aquarium near the St. Lawrence River in Montreal.

The main building will contain galleries for fresh and salt water fishes and invertebrates with special features of Pacific and Atlantic coral reef specimens.

The Aquarium will also exhibit aquatic birds, reptiles and amphibians and trained porpoises will be shown in a pool 120 feet by 30 feet set in an arena seating 1,500 people.

The Aquarium will also have an exhibition hall, public restaurant and extensive research laboratories. Outside the main building hardy mammals will be shown in spacious pools set in landscaped settings. White whales, walruses, polar bears and sea-elephants are at present included in the plans.

It is hoped that the main building will be completed in time to open in 1967 - Canada's Centennial Year and the World Exhibition which is being staged on islands in the St. Lawrence River. The Aquarium has been designed by Gerald T. Iles, the Society's Managing Director.
