## **KwaZulu-Natal Game Auction**

## Record prices were fetched at the KwaZulu-Natal Game Sale held at Mtubatuba on 21 June 1997

South Africa's premier game auction was once again a huge success with game to the value of R6,6 million ming sold to buyers, locally and imernationally. Last year's figure of R8.8 million could well have been surpassed had 6 black rhino not been withdrawn and had not about 100 less white rhino been offered.

The top price for a mature white rhino was R115 000 (R86 000 last vear) and R12 000 for a giraffe. All prices were up compared to last year.

About 1 000 people, including local and foreign buyers, crowded the huge marquee. The proceedings received local and worldwide media exposure with at least three foreign film crews in attendance.

A considerable number of game could be viewed beforehand at bomas and pens in Hluhluwe and Umfolozi. The animals were all in L ud condition and the lots clearly marked with infomation on when and where the animals were captured.

The compact but comprehensive sales catalogue provided buyers with all the neccessary information. Apart from the usual information on the conditions of sale of the Natal Parks Board and of the auctioneers, it contained notes on conditions for export buyers; drugs used on animals; care and feeding of animals; carrying capacity of capture vehicles; transport distances and routes; pens and boma fees and a transport instructions slip.
