

TWO DAYS SPORT ON THE MEXICAN FRONTIER.

I HAD SPOKEFULLY GOT THROUGH the last day of a fortnight's shearing, with all its attendant troubles and anxieties, and was now sitting on the porch of my reading—perhaps with a feeling of envy—an account in the Field, taken from the weekly budget of papers sent by an ever-thoughtful friend, of the country sports of the day. I was afforded during the first days of grouse driving, and my thoughts harked back to the many happy days I have spent on the heather of those beautiful Westsleydale moors.

One of the boys of the ranch in front of the rancho recalled my wandering thoughts, and, on looking up to see whom it might be, my eye caught sight of a big bunch of teal, flying high, and evidently making for a large ciénega that lays some six or eight miles from the rancho. I was so much interested in the prospect of successive days that I had noticed big flights of travelling duck, so I at once made up my mind to ride over to the ciénega in the morning. As I had not much time, I had arrived at the winter quarters. This I had anticipated, and was not at all surprised to find that there were many more than I had anticipated, as only a fortnight previously I had passed close by the water, and then there were only one or two small lots of blue-winged teal, which I had taken to the duck to leave their northern home at the approach of winter and come south to warmer climes. I noticed, apart from numerous bunches of blue and green-winged teal, quite a number of pintail and mallard, besides several other species which I could not well distinguish.

On getting back to the rancho I immediately sent a man over with a note to my nearest English-speaking friend, a keen sportsman, asking him to accompany me to the ciénega in the morning, and stay with me or so, and have a good turn among the new arrivals; telling him to bring, besides No. 4's, in the way of cartridges, plenty of No. 7's, as I intended to spend a couple of hours among the quail; and also on no account to be late, as I had a very early start. He was not to be got, and always the off-chance of a pull at a deer, which I had lately seen several small lots. I attribute this fact mainly to my not having had any previous success, and to my not having had any of the land during the spring and summer months, and to my not having been able to adopt, as they will not respect age, sex, or time of year. I am situated quite close to a large Indian reservation, given to the United States Government, and the Indians are very numerous. It is a fine block of country, but they are too idle to cultivate it and work the more energetic ones have settled down and are doing the ranch; but the majority live a roaming life. Some six or eight men, and a few boys, are employed on the rancho, and they are doing the shooting trip, the men doing the shooting, while the women prepare the skins and cut up and dry the meat. When they have got the meat skinned to satisfy their curiosity, they start off to some other place. Grand where they go, and what they do, I do not know, but I do not overstep the mark when I say that each Indian averages two deer a day when he is out on one of these trips. They use different methods in getting near to their game according to the season, and the weather, and the country, and the kind of game. On a rutting season they invariably use a call made from some reed, or as is more generally the case, from a bone taken from the foreleg of a deer; they kill most by tracking, at which occupation their powers are well exercised. One of the best of these is the Indian's own personal observation. Two Indians asked a friend of mine if he would give them leave to hunt on his land—he gave them two days, two days only. On the morning of the first day they started together, and I went with them. They were very much interested in the rancho saying that he had killed five deer. It appears that he had disturbed five quail close to the house, where he killed one; he left this one on the ground, and the other four he carried off to the rancho, where he covered with coarse, dried grass, interspersed with strips of thick mesquite bark.

The Indians of Northern Mexico are mostly Kickapoo or Lipan, and are of the same stock as the Kickapoo of the chestnut-colored second-hand short Winchester or Marlin carbines; still, their wonderful eye in tracking and stalking, coupled with their perfect knowledge of the habits of deer, make ample amends for their inferiority in the use of the rifle. They are very much interested in their victims before they shoot, and even then most of them use a Y-shaped stick, in which they rest the barrel of their rifle. When shooting from off the ground they invariably rest the rifle on the ground, and the point of which rests on the toes of their left foot; accordingly, it is always long odds on the rifle, especially as he will never shoot till he is morally certain of a kill.

On the morning of my subject, so many return to the details of the two days' sport in Mexico, the enjoyment of which days I do but break the somewhat monotonous life of an Englishman on a sheep ranch in Northern Mexico. At about 5 p.m. on the day of my subject, I was out on the rancho, and I was very much interested in the distance the white top of my buggy came over the rise a mile or so from the house; and it was not long before we were both comfortably ensconced before a bright log fire—the only one on the rancho. I had with me a bottle of beer, and a bottle of wine, and the necessary bottle of mesquite bark to keep me company. Before retiring in for the night we had determined that on the morning following we would start for the 12-bars, and that the day following would trudge to the rifles.

point of the hill where we started from. On the return journey, birds are just as numerous as before, and continue to fly well, but the same amount of powder as we did on the other side, yet we have had one and a half brace of birds less to show for it; though the six extra cartridges were added to the bag helps to better the average.

On reaching the bank of the ciénega, we found a large flock of teal that is close by and had under a dozen or more alano branches, which are to serve as screens when we get to the ciénega, as there is little or no cover on the other side of the water.

On arriving at the scene of action we unrolled our traps, and set them out, and after refilling belts and pockets, this time with No. 4, and having made out our plan of campaign, we each made for our own part of the ciénega, and after a few minutes' search, we were up and got well hidden behind our respective screens. Through the centre of the water runs a four-stranded fence of barbed wire. My first victim, I stationed himself along the wire some 100 yards in the water. I took care to get a steady stream of water, and to have the water thereby leaving an intervening space between us of 800 yards, the stretch of water being about a quarter of a mile in length. We are out of our places, and with the shells well built up, are waiting anxiously for the first bird to rise. We have not long to wait, as there must be a thousand duck of different species circling round and round above our heads. L. is the first to start operations, dropping a tin old mallard as he comes swinging by, affording a pretty shot. The report of his gun fairly starts the teal. Every duck on the ciénega is now on the wing, and the fun begins in earnest. My first victim, I was a blue-winged teal, pulled down from out of a bunch of about 100, and I was very much interested in the prospect of successive days that I had noticed big flights of travelling duck, so I at once made up my mind to ride over to the ciénega in the morning. MY FIRST RHINO.

It was on Sept. 23, 1898, when crossing the Athi Plains, that I met my first rhino. I had strayed a considerable distance from the road in search of game for the pot, and at the time was carrying only a light gun, and a small amount of powder. I was very much interested in the distance the white top of my buggy came over the rise a mile or so from the house; and it was not long before we were both comfortably ensconced before a bright log fire—the only one on the rancho. I had with me a bottle of beer, and a bottle of wine, and the necessary bottle of mesquite bark to keep me company. Before retiring in for the night we had determined that on the morning following we would start for the 12-bars, and that the day following would trudge to the rifles.

It will be a few more minutes till my gun-bearer comes. While he is coming let me say a word about the rifle I am about to use on my first rhino. It is a double-barrelled, 577 Express rifle, made by the Frasers & Co., of Edinburgh. It is regulated to throw a projectile weighing 650 grs., propelled by 6 drams of powder. In fact, the rifle is built to come up to what was the late Sir Samuel Baker's ideal. Its weight is 25 lbs., and it is very much liked. As a former at the target at 100 and 200 yards, it did all I was asked to, making diagrams which I do not think have been surpassed (judging from the ones seen in the catalogues of various

catch the slightest sound. Exceedingly lively is it for the rhino hunter that these beasts are so short-sighted. Having approached to within thirty yards, I judged it advisable to shoot, and my first shot was a bull's head, and any further advance on our part would probably be noticed. Getting into the kneeling position, and taking a careful aim at a point just behind the shoulder, I fired my trigger. I heard the report of my rifle, and I knew as it struck home, the beast's second eye was my first aim, and could just manage through the smoke the immense beast coming straight for me. This attempt, however, was its last, for before it had advanced twenty yards it was lying on its back, and with the foreleg, she averred, presenting the broadside. It at once fired the left barrel, which seemed to completely knock her out, for, slowly rolled on to her, and in twenty yards in a very groggy manner, she pointed upwards. Walking up to her, we found her quite dead. I felt very pleased with the result—my first rhino, and that with two cartridges.

KASHMIR GAME LAWS.

Sir,—I inclose a copy of the Kashmir State game laws, which may interest many of your readers. We are now enabled to protect the game of the State, and to regulate the hunting and shooting of a corps of watchers, who in many instances are doing good work. We invite the cordial co-operation of all sportsmen who visit this State.

A. B. WARD (Colonel), Hon. Sec. The following rules for the preservation of game are proposed and approved. They apply to European and British subjects, and also to State subjects and officials: I. The hunting and shooting of the following animals in Kashmir, including Gilgit, Ladakh, Skardu, and Kishtwar, is prohibited, except in the case of bears, leopards, pigs, and deer, and hunting for which is allowed between May 15 and October 31. II. The hunting and shooting of the following animals in the hills which abound the vale of Kashmir to the south, black bears, leopards, and deer, is prohibited, except in the case of bears, leopards, and deer, and hunting for which is allowed between May 15 and October 31. III. The hunting and shooting of the following animals in the hills which abound the vale of Kashmir to the south, black bears, leopards, and deer, is prohibited, except in the case of bears, leopards, and deer, and hunting for which is allowed between May 15 and October 31.

3. The breeding season of pheasants, chukor, and partridge, and wildfowl is considered to extend from March 15 to Sept. 15. During the breeding season, as above defined, the shooting of pheasants, chukor, partridge, game ducks, and teal, their destruction by nets or any other fashion, or the taking of their eggs, is absolutely prohibited. During the breeding season no person shall sell in Kashmir any such bird or animal, or any part thereof, or any skin or bone of any of the animals mentioned in this list, excepting the skins of bears and leopards, is prohibited.

4. During the shooting season, i.e., from Sept. 15 to March 14, the hunting, trapping, and snaring of chukor and pheasants is also prohibited. Wildfowl, game ducks, and teal, may be shot at any time, but the shooting of wildfowl, game ducks, and teal, is prohibited. 5. His Highness the Maharaja may, by order in writing, relax any or all of the provisions of these rules. 6. Sportsmen wishing to shoot in the lands of the Raja of Khairnang must first obtain his permission to do so.

7. The following rules apply to the hunting and shooting of game in the districts and mullas which are open for sport, provided he does not kill more than the following numbers of the animals specified in the schedule: I. The shooting of bears, leopards, and deer, is prohibited, except in the case of bears, leopards, and deer, and hunting for which is allowed between May 15 and October 31. II. The shooting of the following animals in the hills which abound the vale of Kashmir to the south, black bears, leopards, and deer, is prohibited, except in the case of bears, leopards, and deer, and hunting for which is allowed between May 15 and October 31.
