WHITE RHINOCEROS SHOT.

INDIGNATION IN ZULULAND.

(FROM OUR CORRESPONDENT.)

DURBAN, AUG. 23.

Indignation has been caused in Zulu-
land by the discovery that two young
white rhinoceros had been shot while
wallowing in a river, and their bodies left
to decay. The animals formed part of a
herd of about 35, all that are known to
exist in South Africa. It is believed that
the animals were shot by a supporter of
the movement for the abolition of the
game reserves in Zululand.

There has been much controversy over
this recently, because of the ravages of
nagana. This disease, which is carried by
the tsetse fly, infects the settlers' cattle,
and it is held in many quarters that the
game are hosts of the disease, and that
with their destruction the disease would
disappear. The Natal Provincial Council
has appointed a special committee to con-
sider the subject, and the Minister of
Lands recently intimated that if any prac-
tical suggestion were made for the re-
moval of the rhinoceros herd to Kruger
Park, in the Northern Transvaal, he would
be pleased to consider it.
