THIS magnificent collection of rare BEASTS and BIRDS from EUROPE, ASIA, AFRICA, NORTH and SOUTH AMERICA, embraces the most extensive variety of ANIMALS ever exhibited to an American public. The Exhibition is accompanied by the celebrated NEW YORK BAND OF MUSIC, who will announce the arrival of the Grand Cavalcade. The whole will be arranged in a splendid PAVILION, adequate to contain 5,000 persons at one time. Seats will be arranged sufficient to contain several hundred persons, in which ladies and juvenile branches of families are first seated. The living specimens of Natural History here represented, will be offered for public gratification at Louisville, (for seven days only,) in rear of the Louisville Hotel, on Market Street, between 6th and 7th, on SATURDAY, 5th November, and continue the 7th, 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th November, when it will positively close.

The principal Animals in this collection are the following:

THE UNICORN, OR RHINOCEROS.

This animal has been the subject of much speculation amongst Naturalists, and is supposed to be the Unicorn of Holy Writ, mentioned and described in the Book of Job. This animal certainly ranks next to the Elephant in size, and many writers consider him equal in bulk. The one here offered for inspection, is the first living Rhinoceros ever brought to this country. He is eight years old; his weight is four thousand two hundred pounds.

The Two Hump'd CAMEL, from Africa; DROMEDARY, from Arabia
ZEBRA, from the Cape of Good Hope; the PERUVIAN LAMA.

ROYAL BENGAL TIGER.

Large Chimpanzee; Jaguar and Bear in one Cage; the Lynx of Japan; the Moose from Africa; the African Ostrich; a pair Emus; two African Pelicans; a pair of Vultures, Macaws, Parrots, &c Together with a large variety of the Monkey species.

The Performance of the Fables and Monkeys will take place at 4 and 5 P. M. For particulars see large bills posted up in the principal Hotels about the city.

There will also be exhibited at the same time and place a Museum, consisting of eighteen WAX FIGURES as large as life, selected from Scudder's American Museum, New York City. Also, two LIVING ANACONDAS, measuring 15 feet in length.
