This animal has been a subject of much speculation among naturalists. It is considered by Theological Commentators, as the Unicorn of Holy Writ, as mentioned and described in the book of Job. This animal certainly tracks next to the Elephant in size, and many writers consider him equal in bulk. He is usually found about 12 feet long, and the circumference of the body about equal to the length, and his height about 5 feet. He is a native of Asia and Africa, and is usually found in those extensive tracts that are frequented by the Elephant, Lion, and Royal Tiger, and subsists entirely on vegetable food. The one here offered for inspection is the first Living Rhinoceros ever brought in this country.
