On his previous visit a **rhinoceros** (supposed to be the same one) was seen but gave him the slip. Being determined to have a shot at the beast he proceeded this time fully prepared, and after staying for two days as near the spot where he saw it last as his duties would permit, word was brought to him that Rhino had made her appearance again. Mr. Grey immediately went out with the Penghulu of the mukim, who is a keen sportsman, and a number of his followers, and after encountering many difficulties the animal was brought down.
