Yesterday two large rhinoceroses, both males, arrived in the St. Katharine Dock by the ship *Ganges*, from Calcutta. They have been upwards of four months on their passage to England, during which time they were fed upon hay and rice, and are in a tolerably healthy state. They are consigned to Messrs. F. C. and E. Mangles, shipowners and merchants in the city. The animals are very fine ones; one is about four and the other five years of age, and there is a vast difference in the size of the animals; the eldest, a large beast standing nearly a foot higher than the other, and is the largest brought to England for many years. They were taken out of the ship in the presence of a large concourse of persons assembled on the quays, and were safely removed in carts to the stables of Messrs. Mangles and Abbott, the ship chandlers, in High-street, Wapping, adjoining the Thames-police. These interesting specimens of the one horned rhinoceros were visited by a great number of scientific gentlemen during the afternoon, and they afforded a great treat to the lovers of natural history.

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
