An Eastern King's Live Stock.—Perhaps the following abstract of the sale of live stock, the property of the King of Oude, will not be uninteresting. About 2,840 bullocks, 220 horses, ponies, tanguns, &c, 110 buffaloes and calves, 295 cows and calves, 12 camels, 2 giraffes (cameleopards), 64 dogs, 18 tigers, 3 leopards, 4 lynxes, 3 rhinoceroses, 1 common leopard (tendoah), 42 deer, 4 asses, 200 goats and kids, 50 rams, 114 sheep, 3 elks, 60 hawks, 1 bear, 1 hyena, 1 wolf, a jackal and a porcupine, 10,000 pigeons, 70 guineafowls, 920 geese, ducks, &c., 1,480 small birds, 565 cocks and hens, and 128 elephants.
