President-elect Carter

Democratic candidate, now President-elect Jimmy Carter visited the Zoo on Saturday, 25 September, accompanied by California Governor Jerry Brown. During the brief stop at the Zoo, the President-elect called the San Diego Zoo "probably the best zoo in the country" and made a plea for expanded wildlife conservation programs. He asked his host, Zoo Director Charles Bieler, about the Zoological Society's efforts to breed endangered species. Zoo Teacher Pegi Harvey introduced Mr. Carter to several animals used in educational programs, including Rosy, a California Boa.

White Rhino Birth

A male Southern White Rhinoceros was born on 3 November 1976, and he was named "Karanga."
