The Palindrome with more

Seven decades of ZOONOOZ covers are represented here. From left to right, ZOONOOZ as it appeared from the 1920s through the 1970s, and the new look with which we enter the 80s. Through all these changes, the design has maintained the unique properties of the palindrome.

W. B. France created the name for a column in the now defunct San Diego Sun, which carried the motto: "The same Backward, Forward or Upside Down." It was listed as "published every now and then." For a while after France donated the name to the Zoo for its new magazine which debuted in 1926, the magazine was also published every now and then. By

1934, it maintained a monthly schedule.

The uniqueness of the name was reported by Bob Frazier in a 1974 column for Eugene, Oregon's *Register-Guard*. In a lengthy discussion of palindromitis he cited the San Diego Zoo's ZOONOOZ as "an ultimate palindrome." It was mentioned in *Time* magazine in 1965, and in the long, hot summer of 1966, it occupied correspondence between members of the press from Washington, D.C. to San Diego, and experts in New York and Los Angeles were called on to come up with a name for such a phenomenon. From June through August they deliberated, finally settling on "upside-down palindrome."
