## **Conservation Award**

THE 24TH Conservation Medal of the Zoological Society of San Diego was awarded to Professor Dr. Ernst M. Lang, director of the Basel Zoo in Switzerland, for his extensive work in conservation and breeding programs. Under his direction the Basel Zoo has become world famous for the breeding of Indian Rhinoceros, Pigmy Hippotamuses, Lowland Gorillas, Spectacled Bears and flamingos. That zoo became one of the first to regularly breed more animals than it acquired by purchase or trade.

Prof. Lang received his medal from Director Charles Bieler during the 1976 meeting of the International Union of Directors of Zoological Gardens held last November in Caracas, Venezuela.

Prof. Lang has visited the San Diego Zoo many times, and was partly responsible for the acquisition of Lasai, a male Indian Rhinoceros born at the Basel Zoo. Prof. Lang discussed Lasai's background in the January 1967 issue of ZOONOOZ.

Prof. Lang is a veterinarian, and has continued to practice veterinary medicine during his tenure as zoo director. He has edited, with Dr. Heinz-Georg Klös of Berlin, an authoritative work on zoo animal medicine. Prof. Lang was president of the International Union of Directors of Zoological Gardens from 1965 to 1967 and has been active in several international conservation organizations. In 1963 he joined the staff of the University of Basel, and was named Professor of Zoo Biology in 1972.

Director Charles Bieler awarded a certificate to Jane Elizabeth Meier, D.V.M., at an Animal Health meeting in November in recognition of the completion of a 15-month veterinary internship. Dr. Meier, a 1975 graduate of Purdue University, is the eighth veterinarian to complete the internship at the Zoo hospital. She has joined the Zoo staff as an associate veterinarian.
