CINCINNATI ZOO ANNOUNCES NOTABLE BIRTHS

With the births of a male and a female black rhinoceros in December 1985, the Cincinnati Zoo has achieved a world record for births of this vanishing species in a single institution. Since 1959, the zoo recorded the births of 13 black rhinoceros, 12 of which survived.

SPECTACLED BEAR STUDBOOK PUBLISHED

The International Studbook for the Spectacled bear was recently published by the Lincoln Park Zoological Gardens. The data is current through 31 December 1984 and contains several management related articles. A complete bibliography on the species is particularly useful; and the entire pedigree is printed in English, German and Spanish. The studbook lists 54/48 spectacled bears living in 39 zoos in 17 countries.
