



BLACK RHINO EXHIBIT OPENS AT ZOO ATLANTA

Zoo Atlanta opened its new black rhino exhibit in mid-April. The new exhibit, located in the zoo's Masai Mara complex, simulates the terrain of East Africa, with tall grasses, thorny bushes and open plains. It is adjacent to the giraffes, antelopes and ostriches. A stream-filled moat allows for close-up viewing. Graphic presentations explain the plight of the rhino in the wild. A three-year-old male black rhino has recently been acquired for the exhibit.

AQUARIUM OPENS NEW EXHIBIT

The Migrating Exhibit, which recently opened at the National Aquarium in Baltimore, replicates an underwater view of a bank along the Chesapeake Bay shoreline and is home to 150 juvenile rockfish. The hatchery-raised rockfish were acquired from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. A third of the fish are tagged with a number that corresponds to records of release dates and locations. The new exhibit educates visitors about the way fisheries biologists study populations and establish fishing regulations. In addition, the Migrating Exhibit is the first major exhibit at the aquarium to be built in-house from design to display.
