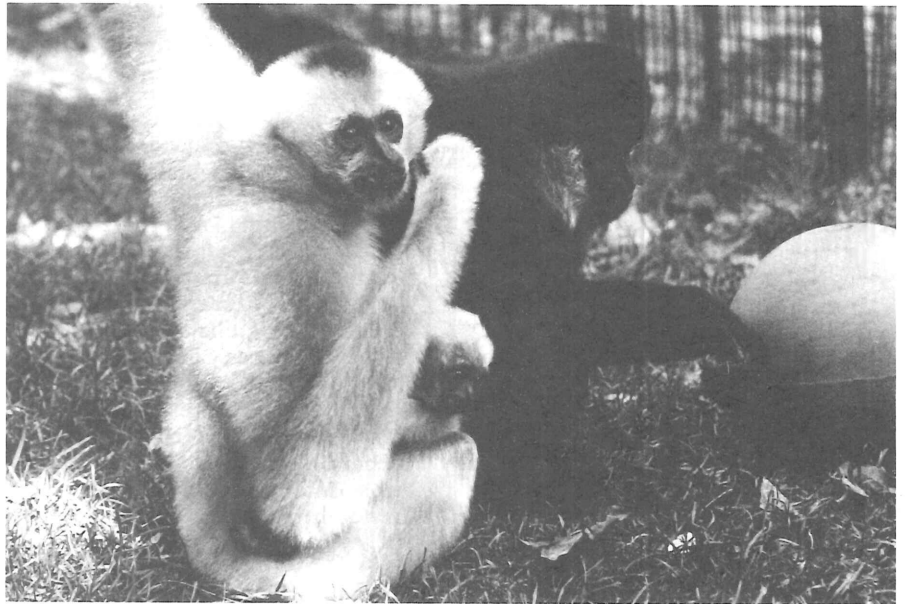

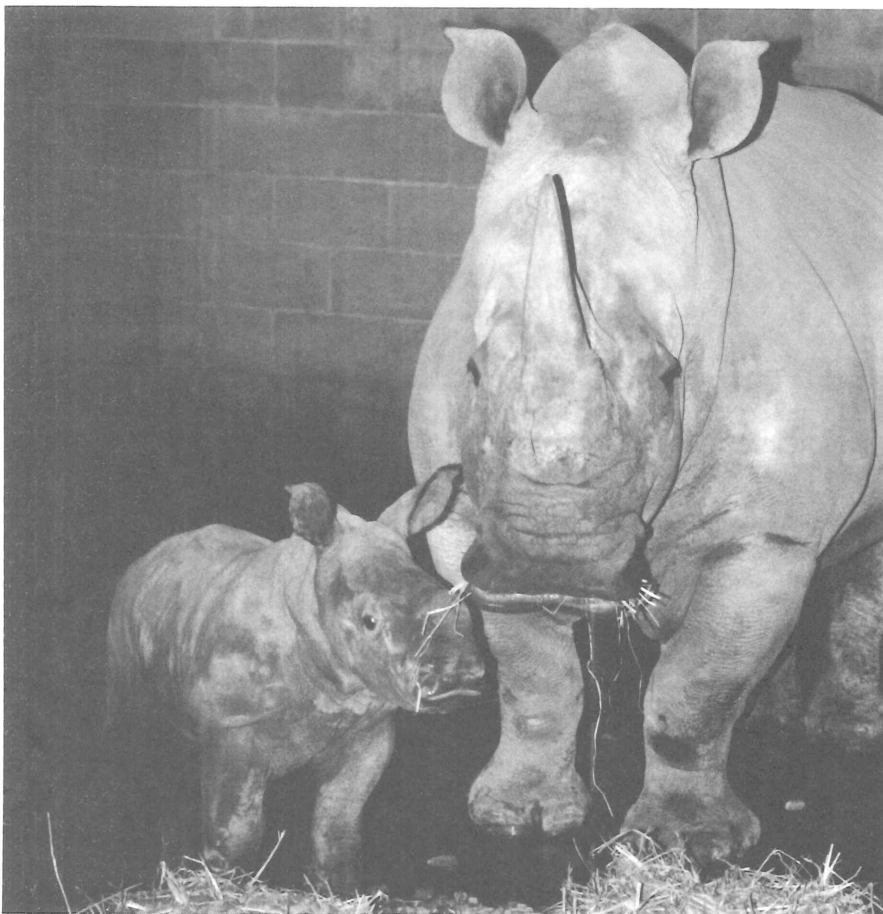
TWO WHITE-CHEEKED GIBBONS BORN AT THE NATIONAL ZOO

Two white-cheeked gibbon infants (*Hylobates concolor*) were born at the National Zoological Park on 13 and 30 August 1990. We believe the younger infant, pictured here, represents the first, second-generation captive birth for the species. The male was born at the zoo, and the female is on loan from the Metro Washington Park Zoo, Portland.
