- (3) Crocodile Pool—The railing round the pool was painted.
- (4) Peafowl Pavilion-Wire-netting was repaired and ironwork repainted
- (5) Lalgola House—Inside walls were lime-washed and outside colour-washed. The iron partition fencing of one of the enclosures which was broken down by a falling tree after a storm was repaired and wirenetting repaired in many places.
- (6) Paddocks—The iron fencing of the paddocks and partitions were repaired and coal-tarred. The kiosks were repaired and repainted.
- (7) Barking deer Enclosure—The ground being low was under water during the rainy season. It was raised and the shed was thoroughly overhauled and painted and a dwarf wall was built round it.
- (8) Sonebursa Enclosure—Inside walls were lime-washed and outside colour-washed. Repairs were done to the surface drain and the ground was raised. The woodwork was repaired where necessary and was painted.
- (9) Rhinoceros Enclosure—The house was repaired and colour-washed and the dwarf wall and fencing painted.
- (10) Crane Enclosure—The wooden sheds were absolutely worn out and required thorough overhauling. They were accordingly repaired and repainted and the iron and wire-fencing repainted.
- (11) Murshid thad House—Inside walls were limewashed and outside colour-washed. Some of the glass panes were replaced and wire-netting repaired.
