INDIAN MUSEUM.

1851 to 1908.

This Inventory includes all the objects of Indian or allied origin, acquired by and for the South Kensington Museum, which were allotted to the Indian Museum when the Victoria and Albert Museum was divided into Departments as from the 1st January 1909.

During each of the years from 1851 to 1908 some of the objects received "Art Museum" registration.

✕ In 1880 the "India Museum" was transferred from the custody of the India Office to that of the Science and Art Department. The objects so transferred are not recorded in this Inventory, but in a volume printed in 1880, and were numbered in two series—1 to 9283, and 01 to 09405 (see note opposite. →)

From 1881 to 1902 an "I.S." registration was given to most of the objects acquired for the Indian Museum.

From 1903 to 1908 inclusive, all objects received "Art Museum" registration.

From 1909 onwards, objects acquired for the Indian Museum have received "I.M." registration.

All objects in this Inventory are Indian, and 19th century, unless otherwise specified.

NOTE.

THE collection of examples of Indian Art and Manufactures, of which this is an Inventory, was handed over by the India Office to the custody of the Science and Art Department of the Committee of Council on Education in November 1879; thenceforth to form a portion of the South Kensington Museum.

The examination and numbering of the objects, and the preparation of an Inventory for official use, and which might also serve for labelling purposes, were at once commenced. As it was absolutely necessary that these works should be completed as speedily as possible, two series of numbers were started, one from 1 upwards, the other from 01 upwards, thus enabling two sets of Museum officers to work at the same time, and a double quantity of MS. to be sent to the printers from day to day. These series respectively mount up to 9,821 and ~~09,245~~, giving a total of ~~19,066~~ objects.
