Kota art most rewarding: Historian Joachim Bautze

There is a story behind each painting in Kota art". "Kota region is rich in cultural heritage, and the art

of Kota, and in particular its miniature paintings, are very unique and world renowned," Maharao Ijyaraj Singh said.

Jaidev Singh said the Kota School of Miniature Art is something the world needs to see, and something that everyone in Kota today should be proud of.

The RMS Museum Trust also organized a guided tour of the Garh led by Dr Bautze on Sunday morning.
