PARTS OF QUADRUPEDS. &c.

(A) Skull of the Babiroussa, a curious species of wild hog, having a pair of large curved tusks in each jaw, from *Borneo.*

Horn of a Rhinoceros, from the *Cape of Good Hope*, polished.

Parts of the Hide of the Rhinoceros, remarkable for its thickness, being pistol-proof.

— This thickness of skin is necessary for an animal who, in his passage in the woods, makes his way through any part, turning aside for nothing but large trees. — See *Kolpin's Natural History of the Cape of Good Hope.*

Jaws of the Beaver, remarkable for its fore teeth or cutters, which are so deeply and strongly fixed in the jaws, that they gnaw asunder branches of trees of the thickness of man's wrist, when forming their habitations, from *North America.*
