As of this year, EAZA will introduce a second award category, i.e. Institutional Excellence. Awards in this category will be granted out annually to celebrate excellence in the core areas of zoo and aquarium activity.

The awards recognise professional excellence and outstanding achievements of conservation, education, research and exhibit design in European zoos and aquaria.

on average, the service
was rated with an 8.5
(on a scale of 1 to 10). As
a result of the responses to
the questionnaire, several
minor aspects of the service

The most important results of the survey are:

 The suggested leg band size for scarlet and glossy ibises has been changed to 12 - 15 mm (instead of 14 - 18 mm);

will be adjusted.

- The use of glue to close the bands will be promoted more strongly and a study to determine the best type of glue will be carried out;
- One or more additional colour/engraving combinations will be added to the ones currently available;
- Many institutions were interested in an expansion of the service for other species, therefore a study to expand the service with bands for several taxa (especially vultures, anseriformes and galliformes) will be carried out in cooperation with the relevant TAGs.


