



2. On the 6th January 1962 for the second time an Okapi baby was born: a male, called Aketi.

DEATH OF OLDEST INDIAN RHINOS

On January 25th. 1962, "Bessie", the oldest captive Rhino in the world, died at the New York Bronx Zoo. She was acquired from Frank Buck on 24th May, 1923. Alsso around the first of the year "Harry", the Indian Rhino at the St. Louis Zoological Park, died. He likewise was obtained from Frank Buck and had lived in the St. Louis Zoo since 19th January, 1934.

These were the oldest Indian Rhinos in the U.S.A. At present there are 7 Great Indian Rhinos in America: 2 at Chicago (Brookfield): 2 at Philadelphia; 2 at Milwaukee, and 1 at Washington D.C.
