Kuala Lumpur - Malaya

Major A.N. Weinman, Director of the new Malayan National Zoo informed us as follows:

"Regarding the Malayan National Zoo we have about 150 animals in temporary accommodation and others from many different countries will arrive as soon as accommodation is ready. We already have outstanding animals like Bengal Tigers, Sumatra Tigers, Indian Lions, Black Panther, Clouded Leopard, Malayan Tapir, King Cobra and Slow Loris.

I was sent to Karachi to select a site and plan a National Zoo for Pakistan by the Malayan Prime Minister, Tunku Abdul Rahman. A suitable site of 300 acres was found and on completion of my report and plans I returned to Kuala Lumpur."

London - England

The world's largest zoo has received many interesting and valuable additions. From Dr. K. C. Searle of Hong Kong came a male Grey Gibbon (Hylobates moloch); 2 Blue Whistling Thrushes (Myophonus caeruleus) and two White-eared Fruit Doves (Phapitreron leucotis). Presented by the complement of the HMS Jaguar was a male Jaguar, who joined a pair of the same species recently purchased. New to the collection were 2 Sickle-winged Guans (Chaempetes unicolor) and a single Brown-hooded Kingfisher (Halcyon albiventris). Eleven Canadian Timber Wolves, born earlier in the year, were transferred from Whipsnade Zoological Park. On October 19th a trio of Siberian Ibex took up residence on the famed Mappin Terraces, where the Marco Polo Sheep, Rocky Mountain Sheep, Aoudads and other inhabitants of the mountain regions reside. Three Grey Seals were collected on the Orkney Islands and a quintet of Rock Hyrax (Procavia habessinica) arrived from Kenya.

Nuremberg - Germany

During the first three months of 1963, the following were born and reared:

2 Eurasian brown bears (Ursus arctos), I Red Kangaroo (Megaleia rufa), 2 African Porcupine (Hystrix africae-australis), 3 Four-horned Sheep and many other sheep and goats in the Children's-Zoo.

Since 1950 we have reared 50 Eurasian brown bears and 20 Polar Bears, all born in het Nuremberg 200.

New in the collection are 1,2 Ceylon Dwarf Zebu and 2,2 Crested Screamer (Chauna cristata).
