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Introduction

The WILDb National (Summary) Database is a Microsoft Access Database Application designed to aggregate and analyse data collected at 'subpopulation' level with the WILDb Local Database application. It was developed for use by National Parks and Conservancies by WWF SARPO as part of the SADC Regional Programme for Rhino Conservation, funded by the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Directorate General for Development Cooperation. Using this manual

This document is a more detailed supplement to the WILDb "Getting Started" manual, and assumes you are familiar with the introductory material presented there.
