COTTON'S RHINOCEROS IN THE BERLIN MUSEUM.—A fine specimen of the northern race of the white, or broad-mouthed, rhinoceros, named by Mr. Lydekker in honour of Major Powell Cotton, has been presented to the Berlin Museum of Natural History by Dr. Berger. The animal was shot by the donor in the Lado enclave, and the preparation of the skin for preservative treatment occupied three days. The labour, however, was fully justified, for the skin reached Berlin in excellent condition. Herr Lamm, the chief taxidermist, carried out the work of mounting in a very satisfactory manner, and the specimen, the first received in Germany, has been placed in a prominent position in the great hall.

THE BERLIN ZOOLOGICAL GARDEN.—The fine collection of great beasts of prey in the Berlin Zoological Garden has been increased by the gift of two male lion cubs from Captain Stieber, who recently returned from the Cameroons. These animals were obtained in the neighbourhood of Lake Chad; they bore the journey down to the coast and the passage to Europe very well, and were received in good condition. Hitherto this Western race does not appear to have been represented in the Berlin Garden.

BOOTS FOR POOR CHILDREN.—Canon Walpole, D.D., writes from the Rectory, Lambeth:—"In this wet season all who value the comfort of going dry-shod will sympathize with the large number of children who, owing to stress of home circumstances, are compelled to sit in school for hours together with the cold chill of damp frost striking through the soles of their feet. In some respects this is worse than hunger, for it has worse results. Whilst the County Council has power to provide for the latter, we are left to the charitably disposed of the public to provide for the former. I write on behalf of ten schools in North Lambeth, one of which needs 150 pairs of boots at once. Our Parochial Relief Committee has already done something, but in such a poor neighbourhood as this our resources are already strained for other urgent needs. May I add that any funds entrusted to me will be handed over to the excellent care committees which are doing such valuable work for our children, and donors may be assured that their money will be used to the best advantage?"
