to "On the Brink of Extinction" (Spring, 1989):

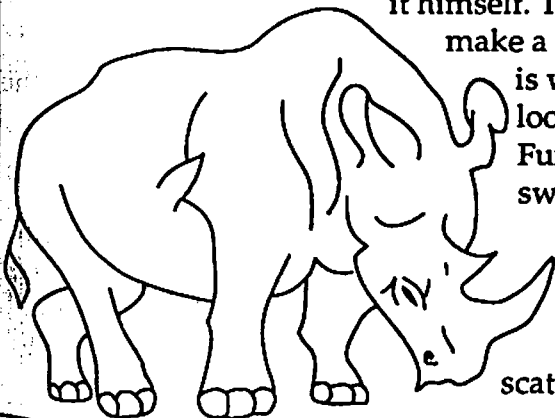
South Africa is now the primary entrepot for rhino horn and ivory. North Yemen has long since ceased to be the largest rhino horn market (dagger handles). South Africa with one of the few convertible currencies in Africa (gold standard) and a large arms industry, has now become the African villain. Poaching for hard currency is a way to maximize profits via the black market. According to the *Monitor* (Washington, D.C.), African guerilla armies are financing their civil wars, using hard currency earned thru poaching. Example: Jonas Savimbi's Unita forces in Angola. Taiwan has also become the leading importer of rhino horn and ivory, with direct commercial flights from South Africa. North Yemen's economy was hard hit by the oil slump due to the war between Iraq and Iran. North Yemen oil workers were sent home and the high wages cease to exist.

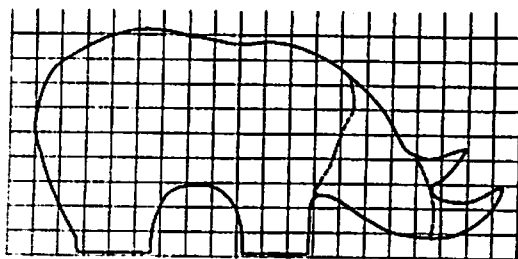
Summer Sales...

PLENTIFUL PACHYDERMS?

Here's a report from the January / February 1989 issue of SWARA, magazine of the East African Wildlife Society.

"There are at least 47 rhinos in Nairobi National Park with probably another five in the forest. This means that the population is doing very well.

"Two more northern white rhino calves were born in Garamba National Park, Zaire in the fall of 1987. This brings the known number of northern white rhinos at Garamba to 21. Since 1983 nine calves are known to have been born and survived. This rate of reproduction considerably exceeds that in captivity under present conditions. Improvements to the park and the increase in the rhino population have fully justified the decision to protect the animals within their natural habitat but the operations in the park still rely heavily on international aid. A long-term continuation of some form of aid and development of tourism to improve the park's income will continue to be important for the survival of the rhinos and the park.

"Two separate sightings of northern white rhinos have been reported in Southern National park in Sudan. While this confirms that some still remain in Sudan, the current political situation there means that very little can be done about them and the best hope for the survival of the subspecies in the wild remains at Garamba.

"India probably has the best record for improving rhino conservation in Asia, with the number of rhinos killed having declined from 50 in 1986 to 41 in 1987. India has built up its rhino population from a few dozen to over 1,300 today."

them to seek rhinos whenever they are out shopping. It has made my quest much easier other than the continual battle to finance my rhino habit.

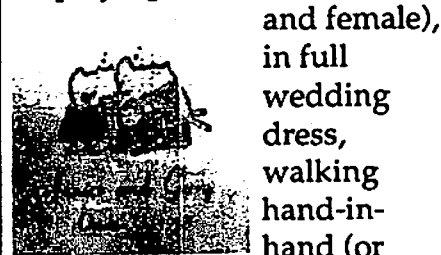

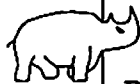

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Boys & Girls, Do Not Try This At Home!

"Dream of the Rhinocereos" is a limited edition viscosity etching. This is a unique method of printing more than one color from a single etching plate. In traditional etching a separate plate is generally used for each color. The viscosity technique is based on the principle that an oily ink will reject a less oily (or viscous) ink. The zinc viscosity plate has to be etched with nitric acid to many different levels. The finished plate is first inked in the traditional manner, rubbing the ink into the lower levels and then wiping the surface clean. Then a second color is selected, oil is added, and it is rolled onto the surface of the plate. A third color is rolled on top of this. The second color, on the surface, should reject most of the third. Then the plate is printed onto damp rag paper with the tremendous pressure of an etching press. What actually happens is magical! The colors react in all sorts of strange ways and, depending on the oiliness of the inks, the thickness of the rolled ink, the pressure applied to the rollers, and any number of other conditions, each print is a little (or sometimes a lot) different from the others. I just snagged one and it is truly different. Price: \$130 including postage. MC or VISA accepted.
