STUTTGART, GERMANY

The Wilhelma Zoo is especially proud to announce the birth of a male Indian rhino. The female was covered in Basle Zoo, as the male Rhino of the Wilhelma was too young. The birth took place after a gestation period of 480 days. The baby was born at 3.13 a.m. To be sure that the birth went well the stall was observed day and night by a TV-monitor and the film of the birth was put on a videorecorder too. Other recent births at Wilhelma zoo were: 0.2 Alpaka; 1.0 Grevy-zebra (the 22nd born in the Wilhelma); 0.1 Axis deer; 1 drill; 5 Four-Eye fishes; (*Anableps-anableps*) – second generation born in the zoo; Poisonous Arrow frogs (*Phyllobates lugubris* and *denbrobates auratus*).

Acquisitions include: 2.2 Pale-headed saki; 1.1 Ruffed lemur; 1.0 Sea-elephants; 1.1 Crowned Wood partridge; 0.1 Red Bird of paradise; 7

Guanay-cormorants and a large collection of Hawaiian Coral fish. Some of the fish were imported for the first time to Germany.
