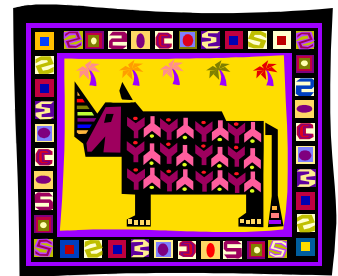
Logo Competition Winner

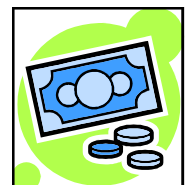

Program Guidelines

APPLICANT INFORMATION

General:

The Rhino Keeper Association (RKA) has developed a program that will provide rhino keepers the opportunity to expand their knowledge and husbandry experience. This program has been designed to enable rhino keepers to work at other institutions to familiarize themselves with different management styles. Due to the professional nature of this program, it is only available to Professional or Associate Rhino Keeper Association members.

The RKA has selected facilities with different management styles to maximize the keepers' potential for enhancing their expertise. It is the hope of the Rhino Keeper Association that the institutions participating in this program will take this opportunity to share their trials, tribulations, triumphs and successes with their professional colleagues. At this time, institutions are: Cincinnati Zoo and Botanical Gardens, The Wilds, Columbus Zoo and Aquarium, and San Diego Zoo's Wild Animal Park. The concept of the program is quite simple, but we feel it is an invaluable tool for expanding the skills of rhino keepers by providing them the opportunity to work alongside their colleagues and learn the nuances of that institution's husbandry practices.

Approval process:

The keeper participating in this program must not only have their institution's authorization, but agreement to pay their wages. The institution's approval requires that employee is covered by their institution's workmen's compensation and will provide documentation of personal health insurance. This will provide assurance that the hosting institution will not be liable to cover medical costs. When application has been approved, there will be a fee of \$10 to be contributed to the RKA scholarship fund.

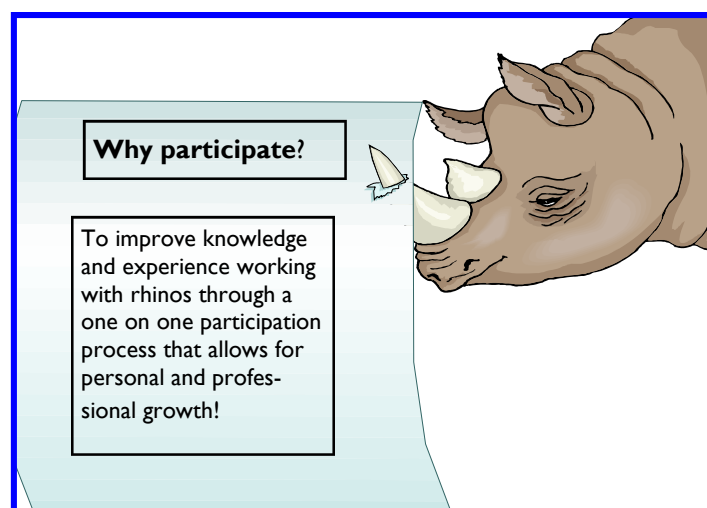
INSTITUTIONAL INFORMATION

Responsibilities of the keeper's institution:

It will be the responsibility of the keeper's institution, or the keeper him/herself, to cover any expenses including travel, housing (if necessary) and food. The keeper's supervisor must complete the section of the application in regards to workman's compensation plan and information in regards to employee's medical coverage. As stated in the application, please include any additional documentation your institution may require to participate in this program.

Responsibilities of the hosting institution:

The Rhino Keeper Association would simply ask the hosting institution to be willing to let interested and approved applicants work alongside their professional staff. We would like each institution to allot a time frame that they could offer this program to interested individuals and let the association know their specific details. Each facility's time allotment will dictate the amount of time available and subsequently the number of keeper(s) that could participate in this program. We would also like to solicit input from institutions regarding options that may be available in regards to housing in an attempt to reduce the expenses to the participants. We would also ask that these institutions provide any additional documentation that might be required so they can be completed in a timely manner. The final decision regarding applicant's acceptance into the program is based on input by the hosting institution. A candidate for the program can be rejected by the hosting institution, even though they may have already received approval from their institution and/or RKA. Hosting institution will not be responsible for employee's wages during keeper professional development at their institution.

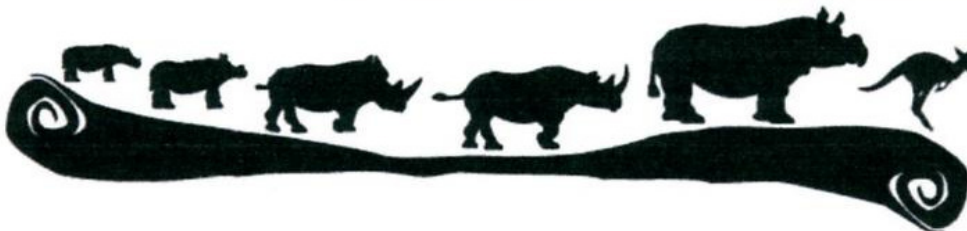

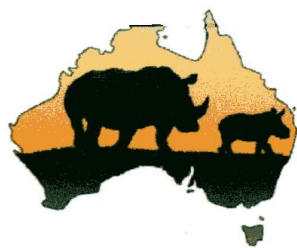

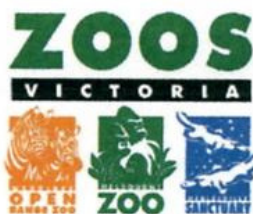

The Zoos Victoria management team has created a new strategic direction, breaking free of the traditional zoo idea of animals in cages. As part of this we have developed the new Zoos Vision & Values focussing on the four pillars of Conservation, Education, Entertainment and Research.

Vision and Mission: We build enduring relationships between people and wildlife for a future in which humans live in balance with the natural world. Our zoos will be world leading centres for wildlife experience, education, conservation and research - on site, off site and on line. To lead, inspire and empower everyone to connect with wildlife, build knowledge, develop skills and take informed action to conserve the natural world.
