ZIMBABWE UPDATE

We are all aware of the difficult times that have been experienced in Zimbabwe over the past 18 months, and it is apparent that all sections of the community, regardless of race, are being hindered in their quest for a normal life. In such times of economical and political unrest it is not surprising that wildlife preservation is cast towards the bottom of the list of priorities.

Fortunately, there are very few reports of rhino losses, perhaps 8 in total, but there is some uncertainty of casualties in the private conservancies where many thousands of squatters continue to occupy. If this data is correct, then we can be thankful that it isn't a worse scenario.

However, rampant poaching of small game animals continues unabated throughout the whole of the country. This is killing hundreds of animals per week, mostly from wire snares causing a painful death.

One of the late Andy Searle's colleagues, Paul de Montille, owner of Miombo Lodge, has continued with Andy's work in the Dete region of Hwange National Park, namely the darting and releasing of snared animals. This is being done in a purely voluntary capacity by Paul and he has sought the help of various sponsors in England and Australia. The SAVE FOUNDATION has been supporting this work, via the David Gower Black Rhino Fund in Harare. We are purchasing vital and expensive drugs for Paul's use in the field.

We have been receiving regular monthly email updates, together with graphic stories and pictures. We congratulate Paul and his team, particularly his anti-poaching scout Nkulemane, who has done a brilliant job in collecting hundreds of snares and tracking injured animals.

We are proud to be associated with this project and will continue to offer our support. If any of our members would like to receive Paul's email reports, then please advise AnneMaree by email.

Working nearby, and a frequent visitor to Miombo, is Julia Salnicki, former chairperson of our NSW branch. Julia is conducting some very good research into hyena activity, and receives on-going support from within the SAVE FOUNDATION community.

This is a wildlife adventure story depicting the life in the animal community and was filmed against the scenic beauty of Southern Africa including the Kalahari, Namibia, Zimbabwe and Botswana.

This is an entertaining and informative look at Africa's wildlife, and was produced and directed by Jamie Uys, creator of 'The Gods must be crazy' epics.

During the year we made a \$5,000 donation to the David Shepherd Conservation Foundation in England, to further help their excellent work with Zambian anti-poaching, Siberian tigers and Namibian black rhinos. Thirty bivouacs were donated to Mana Pools camp last November, to help protect the anti-poaching scouts during the summer rains.

We have a request from Norman English, warden of Sinamatella intensive protection zone, for support with deployment of his field patrols. Due to the scarcity of diesel and funding, and a recent 70% fuel price hike, he is no longer able to drop off his scouts on the park perimeter for their 14 day patrols. The guys have requested some solid bicycles that they can use, and have offered a periodic payment system so that they can own them within 12 months. Hopefully, this will ensure a high degree of maintenance. So, the SAVE FOUNDATION is in the process of purchasing 12 such bicycles.

ANDY SEARLE MEMORIAL FUND

Thank you to all our supporters who have most kindly given \$36,000 for Lol and Drew Searle. In particular, we thank Peter Hall from Hunter Hall Investment Management Limited for their most generous donation. Lol and Drew have been unable to thank you all personally, and have asked to express their appreciation through this newsheet. At the beginning of this year, they took up new residency at Chinhoyi Junior School, where Lol is serving as 'matron' and Drew awaits his first lessons. We are holding all the funds in Perth and we are advised that there is no immediate call on them.

LOCAL NEWS

Our annual safari last year was for 11 days and included Imire, Spurwing Island, Kariba, the

Kingdom at Victoria Falls, Elephant Valley Lodge in Chobe and Gubanare camp in Okvango delta. It was a fabulous trip and raised some \$6,000 for the cause.

We thank our honorary auditors, Irvine Partners, for their work, and Robin and Rebecca Ireland for their kind gift of \$400 worth of boat parts for Mana Pools in the Zambezi Valley.

Unfortunately, Brett Lee had promised to support but injured his elbow that afternoon. Our compere for the evening was Tony Greig and the key players provided great entertainment for the assembled guests.

We have just heard of the sad death of Trevor Madondo, one of Zimbabwe's opening batsmen on the tour. Trevor died from malaria and our condolences go to his family in Zimbabwe. He was a widely respected member of the national team.

As usual, the main fund-raising came from the auction and there was a huge array of cricketing memorabilia, paintings and african stone carvings. Spirited bidding took place with most of the items and our main supporters were Celeste and Rob Baker, Trevor and Fay Pitcher, Craig and Margaret Flugge, Rod and Dee Pollit, Tony Percival, Owen Stickels and Allan Bale.

The total proceeds from both the dinner and the auction amounted to a mammoth \$40,000 going into our kitty for rhino conservation in Zimbabwe. They hope to be stocked with rhinos from a nearby project that has been so successful that some need to be moved to another habitat.
