RHINOS CONTINUE TO FLOURISH IN ZIMBABWE

Three of your Executive, the President, Vice-President and General Duties Officer, recently spent a fortnight in Zimbabwe visiting eight projects for which the SAVE FOUNDATION has offered funds in recent years. We were delighted with the majority of what we saw, both in the Intensive Protection Zones and private Conservancies. In particular, we visited the Midlands Black Rhino Conservancy, Matopo Intensive Protection Zone (IPZ), Gourlays Rhino Project, Bubiana Conservancy, Sinamatella IPZ, Matusadona IPZ and Imire Rhino Project.

During this trip the following equipment was presented: 1 marine diesel engine, 100 pairs of boots, 70 backpacks, 4 hand-held radios, land-cruiser parts, a computer printer, 8 4WD tyres, kindly donated by **Goodyear Tyres** and 3 months vitamin supplies for the scouts, courtesy of **Amway**.

A full report, including video of most of the projects, will be given at a **General Meeting** for members and their friends on **Wednesday 1 November**, at 7.30 pm, at the **Loftus Community Centre**. Please indicate your intention to attend by Friday 27 October, so that we can prepare some light refreshments and an appropriate sized room. In a nutshell, there has been no rhino poaching since March last year, and approximately 20 calves have been born in this time. You will see some of them in the video.

SAFARI '95 AND '96

The magnificent safari was conducted in late August and early September, visiting Imire Game Ranch, Musango Safari Lodge on the shores of Lake Kariba, Linkwasha Camp in the wilderness area of Hwange Park, the mighty Victoria Falls, Camp Okavango in the Okavango Delta, Camp Moremi in the Moremi Wildlife Reserve of Botswana and three camps in Etosha National Park in Namibia. It was a most comprehensive visit and included good game sightings, in particular 28 lions in Namibia and Botswana and 15 black rhinos in Zimbabwe and Namibia. It also raised nearly \$14,000 for our cause.

PERTH ROYAL SHOW

We had a small stand at this year's Show, ably organised and worked by Bob Cooper, Marion Bowers and several members. The rhino money box was the star attraction and \$3,940 in donations was received. Further product sales of \$2,500 resulted in an overall profit of approximately \$4,000. We should like to thank Arthur and Margaret Prior from **Exhibition Hire and Sales** for the kind donation of the display stand, the "anti-poaching tent" and the display furniture.

MELBOURNE NEWS

A most successful rhino ball was held at Prahran Town Hall on Friday 6 October, attended by 308 people. It was a fabulous evening, and our thanks go to the organising committee, ably led by Sue Pennicuik, and also to the Melbourne band, "**Stone Cold Boners**", who donated their services for an hour, and had the whole audience dancing to their rhythms. A small auction was held and the overall profits were approximately \$5,000 for the night.

The following evening, Saturday 7 October, saw the Brisbane rhino ball at "Inn on the Park". In attendance were 130 keen rhino supporters who also had a great time, ably entertained by the comedian, . An auction was also held and the final proceeds for the evening were approximately \$15,000.
