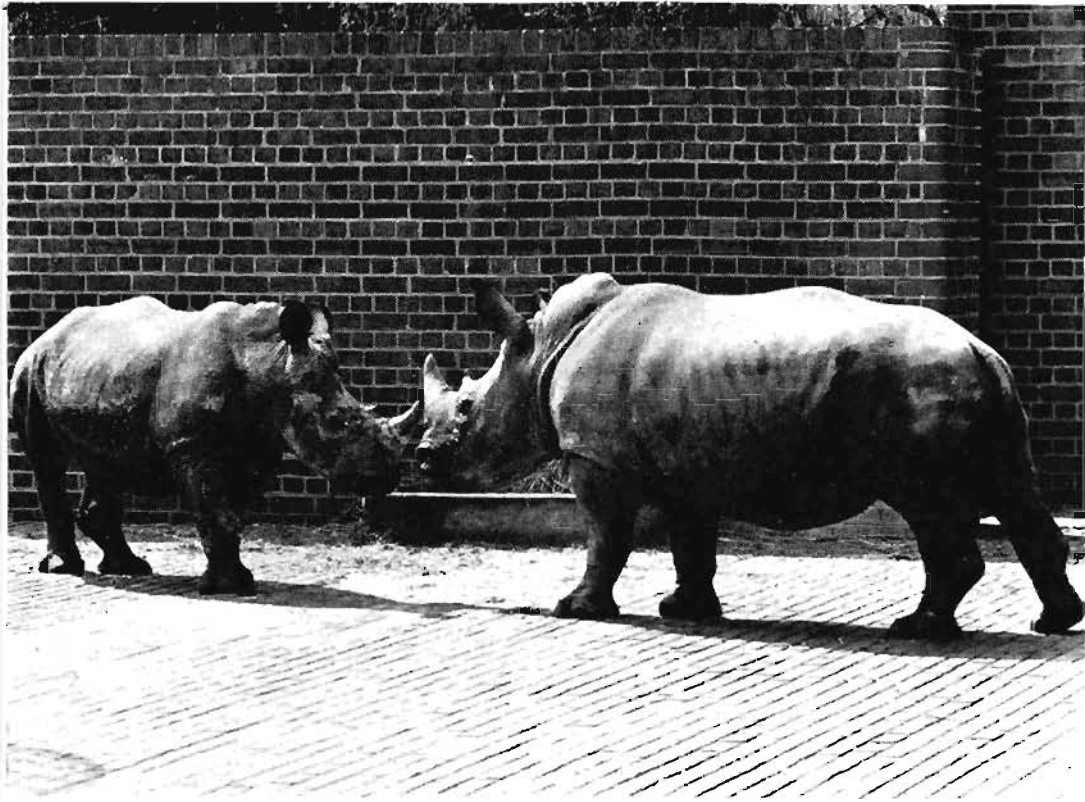

This intelligent baby Chimpanzee, Anne, is the latest addition to our ape collection. She has recently arrived from Holland, weighs 15 lb. and is approximately 1½ years old.

* ZOÖN: (from Greek zōion = animal; akin to Gr. zōē = life;) an animal, a living being.

These two young White Rhinos, Ntjebe and Ikulu, were donated by the Natal Parks, Game and Fish Preservation Board and were transferred early in 1963 to the Pretoria Zoo, where they will find a natural home in the Petrus du Toit Camp towards the end of 1964. Zuluana, the first Natal White Rhino to be captured and exhibited in a zoo, is still alive. The young heifer on the photo was the hundredth White Rhino to be captured by the Natal authorities for transfer purposes — hence the name Ikulu
