

SPORTING.

THE DURBHUNGAH SHOOTING PARTY.—The Maharajah of Durbhungah's shooting party, which included Earl de Grey, Sir W. Gordon-Cumming and Col. Money, broke up on the 26th. The party shot for ten days, of which five were in Nepaul and the rest in North Bhangul-pore. Two out of the ten days were really of the days occupied in marching from one camp to another. The party were seven days after tiger, and one after rhinoceros. Their total bag was as follows :—Tigers 12, deer 57, pigs 83, hares 7, floricans 7, besides smaller game, such as duck, partridge, snipe and quail. They would have got much more small game, if Mr. Shillingford, the captain of the hunt, had allowed them to fire; but he was a strict disciplinarian in not allowing any powder to be burnt for feathers when we were hunting stripes. The tigers are awarded as follows :—Lord de Grey 3, Sir W. Gordon-Cumming 3, Captain MacCall 3, the Maharajah of Durbhungah 1, Col. Money 1, Mr. J. Shillingford 1. The largest tiger fell to Col. Money, and measured 10 feet 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches in length—he was truly a monster animal. The largest tigress Earl de Grey secured: she measured 9 feet 4 inches—a very handsome and beautifully marked animal. Lord de Grey's total bag was—tigers 3, deer 23, pigs 25, hares 2, besides a fair portion of the smaller game.
