Alligators, too, swarm. Several large jhils which lie close to the Rupnarain afforded this party fair sport. On Monday last a Native shikari shot a large leopard in a *khel* near a village a few miles to the west of the Chudangah station on the Eastern Bengal Railway. The season for big game shooting in the Terai and *dearabs* of the Purneah and adjoining districts is now approaching, and no doubt we shall soon hear of the doings of shooting parties in those directions. Shooting in the Sunderbans seem this year to be on the increase. Several parties have been out and have met with varying success. A sportsman has just returned from a trip to the sea face of the Mutlah and succeeded in bagging two rhinoceros and one tiger. He came across the tracks of herds of wild buffalo, but did not succeed in bagging any, though he was within forty yards of a huge animal at one time. He describes the grounds he came across as a sportsman's paradise.
