It has been considered, by *Theological Commentators*, as the Unicorn of Holy Writ, as mentioned and described in the book of Job. This animal certainly ranks next to the Elephant in size, and many writers consider him equal in bulk the is usually found about 12 feet long, and the circumference of the body about equal to the length, and his height about 8 feet. He is a native of Asia and Africa, and is usually found in those extensive forests that are frequented by the Elephant, Lion and Royal Tiger, and subsists entirely on vegetable food. The one here offered for inspection is the first Living Rhinoceros ever brought to this country; years old, his weight is Four Thousand Two Hundred Pounds; he was taken at the foot of one of the Himalaya mountains.
