



FORT WORTH ZOOLOGICAL ASSOCIATION RECEIVES GREATER ONE-HORNED RHINO PAIR

Two greater one-horned rhinoceroses arrived at the Fort Worth Zoological Park from Nepal on 10 May. The rhinos are each approximately eight months old and weigh about 500 pounds. This conservation project was supported by an endowment of the zoo association through World Wildlife Fund, in cooperation with the Nepal government. The funds will also support conservation efforts to assist in a rhino relocation program, to establish a new breeding population and to provide assistance in staff training, technical areas, nature tourism development and research.

WARTHOGS BORN AT SAN ANTONIO ZOO

Three warthogs (*Phacochoerus aethiopicus*) were born at the San Antonio Zoological Gardens and Aquarium on 13 May. Two females survived and are being mother raised. This is the first litter of this species born at the zoo, and it is believed to be the first F2 births in North America since the USDA-restricted imports of swine in the 1960's.
