**A special telegram to the *Indian Daily News*, from Nagrakanta, of the 14th instant, announces that the Cooch Behar party have been fairly successful. They have bagged four rhinoceri, besides bears, deer of all sorts, pigs, and smaller game. Tigers have been conspicuous by their absence, owing chiefly to excessive gun licenses being given to the villagers in this district. In the Khedda operations, one young tusker has been noosed. Another *must* male attacked the noosing tame elephants, biting the end of their tails of two before being driven away.
