MAGNIFICENT PRESENT FROM THE KING OF OUDE TO HIS MAJESTY.

Yesterday the Duke of Argyll East Indiaman, which ar-
 rived a few days ago in the West India Docks, completed the
 unloading of her cargo, among which was a variety of ar-
 ticles of the most costly and magnificent description, which
 had been entrusted to the care of Captain Bristow, the com-
 mander of the vessel, by the King of Oude, as presents to his
 Majesty King William. They consist principally of articles
 for domestic use—namely, a bedstead of solid gold and a table
 of the same metal. There are also two chairs of solid silver,
 besides other articles, the whole made in a manner which
 would do credit to the most expert European mechanic,
 being richly chased and ornamented with carved figures.
 These articles are now lodged in the warehouse of the Dock
 company, and are to remain until further orders. In addi-
 tion to the above, two elephants, two Arabian horses, and two
 dwarf buffaloes have been landed. The elephants are small of
 stature, being as yet but of eleven years of age, and are male
 and female; they are accompanied by attendants, natives of
 India, attired in the splendid dresses of the country, and the
 elephants are accoutred with gilt trappings.

On Thursday night the male elephant was removed in a
 carvan to Mr. Cross's establishment in the Surrey Zoolo-
 gical Gardens, and last night the female was to be removed
 to the Zoological Gardens, Regent's Park, in obedience to the
 commands of his Majesty. We understand that the two Ara-
 bian horses, which are very young and beautiful animals, have
 been conveyed to Windsor. The dwarf buffaloes are of the
 size of the common pig in this country, but are most beautiful
 creatures, and as a curiosity unique. The whole of the pre-
 sents are estimated to be of the value of 80,000l., and no in-
 jury has been sustained during the long voyage to either the
 living or dead stock.

Much interest has been excited in the neighbourhood of
 Limehouse by the gorgeous appearance of the elephants, with
 their splendid trappings glittering with gold and silver, and
 the novel dress of their riders, who were clothed in scarlet
 and gold, parading in the public road. A gentleman belong-
 ing to his Majesty's household accompanied them, and, in-
 deed, has been in charge of the presents from the arrival of the
 vessel.
