WALLACE'S ITINERARY IN THE MALAY ARCHIPELAGO

Wallace followed a quite complicated route through Southeast Asia, spending much time in Singapore, mainland Malaysia, and Borneo, followed by travels to the Moluccas and New Guinea, as well as the larger Indonesian islands of Sulawesi, Java, and Sumatra. His itinerary is here presented in summary form, where all localities within one island are combined into one entry. The dates are compiled from information in Wallace's publications, letters, and notebooks, as well as external data often regarding the movements of ships reported in newspapers. Many dates remain tentative, especially since some of Wallace's later recollections have proved inconsistent with other sources.

In this list, dates are given in the format: day, month (abbreviated), year. The length of stay is calculated according to the nights spent in the locality, hence the day of departure is not usually counted. Periods of travel between the islands have been omitted, as will be easily recognized from the sequence of the list. We have, however, provided details of his outward and homeward journeys on the steamers of the P&O company. The localities are listed according to the names used most frequently by Wallace in his writings, while the currently used designations and spellings are added in brackets to allow retrieval of the places on modern maps.

Wallace employed Charles Allen as an independent collector from January 1860 to February 1862. As Allen apparently did not keep a daily log, all dates relating to his travels are uncertain and approximate. Dates are provided here merely to gain a general picture, but few can be verified exactly. It is likely that Wallace only met Allen on four occasions during this period: Amboyna in January 1860, Ternate in November 1860, and again in December 1860, and Bouru in June 1861.
