This Establishment is the first of the kind formed in this kingdom, except the London Gardens, and combines unprecedented attractions for the *Naturalist*, the *Botanist*, and the general Visitor, and is situated within half-an-hour's walk of the Exchange. It extends over about ten acres of ground tastefully laid out in Walks, Lawns, and Shrubberies, and is planted with Forest Trees, Shrubs, and Flowers of all descriptions.

An AIRIE, for EAGLES, CONDORS, VULTURES, and other Birds of Prey.

AN EXTENSIVE BEAR-PIT,

Occupied by several Specimens of the URSINE TRIBE.

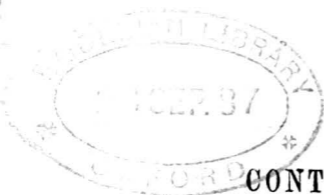
